A volunteer position is available immediately for an Assistant Coach, National Disabled Rifle / Pistol Team.

Reporting to the National Team Head Coach, you will:

- ◆ Assist the Head Coach with the National Disabled Shooting Team training / competition program
- ◆ Assist with the preparation of the detailed annual Team training / competition program budget
- ◆ Assist with the preparation of the annual Team and individual, domestic and international training and competition schedule
- ◆ Assist with the development of long and short term plans and goals for the Team
- ◆ Assist with the organization and conducting of training camps for National Disabled Team members
- ◆ Assist with the development of National Disabled Team selection trials criteria
- ◆ Assist with conducting the National Disabled Team selection trials
- ◆ Assist with the preparation of Sport Canada Athlete Assistance program performance criteria
- ◆ Assist with the organization of all details of international team travel, including but not limited to flight itineraries, hotel reservations, vehicle rentals, competition registration, permits and visa acquisitions
- ◆ Assist with the completion of administrative requirements from Canadian Sport agencies such as Sport Canada as and when required
- ◆ Assist with other technical / administrative duties as and when required

You possess at a minimum the following qualifications:

- ◆ You are a fully certified NCCP level 2 shooting coach, as confirmed by the CAC database, and are actively pursuing NCCP level 3 or equivalent certification
- ◆ You have experience as a competitive rifle and/or pistol shooter
- ◆ You have demonstrated a broad understanding of high performance competition and training technical skills
- ◆ You have strong oral and written communication skills
- ◆ You have strong administrative skills and are competent with electronic communication and messaging systems.
- ◆ You have a proven record of success coaching high performance competitive target shooters
- ◆ You possess a valid drivers license and are able to operate a motor vehicle in foreign countries, in all regions of the world
- ◆ You are physically able to carry quantities of heavy shooting equipment and luggage and assist disabled individuals transferring to and from wheelchairs, in and out of vehicles, and in a variety of situations, including during air flights and daily life situations

The successful applicant will:

- ◆ Be a member in good standing of the Shooting Federation of Canada, as confirmed by the SFC National Office
- ◆ Be a Canadian citizen, or have been a landed immigrant for 3 years prior to the date of application, as demonstrated by a Canadian citizenship document
- ◆ Be able to travel for team business across Canada and throughout the world for periods of up to 3 weeks at a time, any time of the year
- ◆ Have access to electronic communication, such as E-mail, internet, fax, and be familiar with electronic messaging and communication systems

The compatibility between the successful candidate, National Disabled Team, SFC High Performance committee and SFC Executive committee will be considered in the selection process.
