## Purpose

The purpose of this document is to set out and outline, in a clear and fair manner, the qualification process and selection procedures of the Shooting Federation of Canada (SFC) for determining the athletes who will be selected to represent Canada as members of the Canadian team at Major Games and Competitions. The SFC is dedicated to developing high performance athletes with a focus on competing at the highest levels of international competition.

This document outlines SFC policies as they pertain to the ranking and selection of Canadian athletes for international competitions. These policies will remain in effect for the period 2025 - 2028 and include the standards and processes for qualification for the 2028 Los Angeles Olympic Games.

## Performance Objectives

These criteria have been developed with the objective of selecting a team and athletes that have demonstrated the ability or potential to qualify for medal rounds in competition. The goal is to win a minimum of 5 Olympic quotas at the CAT Championship, Pan American Games, and Pan American Championships and two top 15 finishes at Los Angeles 2028. The SFC's secondary objective at all continental championships is to win additional Pan American Games quotas as well as to provide multi-sport Games experience for 2028 Olympic hopefuls and alternates.

## Conflicts in Wording

If a conflict arises between the wording of these SFC Athlete Selection Criteria for Major Games/Competitions 2025-2028 (the Criteria) and an Appendix attached hereto, the Appendix language shall prevail.

## Unforeseen Circumstances

Situations may arise that do not allow these Criteria to be applied as written due to exceptional or unforeseen circumstances. In such situations, any decision, including nomination decisions, will be made by the CEO in consultation with the relevant individual(s) and/or committee(s), subject to SFC Board oversight, and in accordance with the stated performance objectives and selection philosophy and approach as stated herein. Should it be necessary to make any decision in this manner, the SFC will communicate with all affected individuals as soon as possible.

## Responsibilities

The High Performance Committee (HPC) is responsible for developing and approving the selection process and procedures for the team that will be nominated to the Major Games/Competitions listed in the following Major Games / Competitions Selection Summary table (the Table). The National Team Coaches, in consultation with the Technical Director (TD) and/or Chief Executive Officer (CEO) are responsible for the implementation of these procedures. All team nominations, including alternates and staff, will be ratified by the HPC.

The HPC is responsible for ensuring that the process outlined in this document is properly followed and that the selection process is fair and equitable for all candidates. The HPC in consultation with the TD and/or CEO is responsible for the implementation of these procedures and nominations.

## 1. GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR THE SELECTION OF ATHLETES FOR ALL MAJOR GAMES/COMPETITIONS:

To be considered and eligible for selection to any Shooting Federation of Canada Major Games/Competition Team, an athlete is required to:

- Be a current member in good standing of the SFC and High Performance Program (National and Development Team, and, in certain instances, the Identified Team). Such membership implies adherence to all terms and conditions of the SFC Athlete Agreement and / or Major Games/Competitions agreement.
- Be a Canadian citizen; if naturalized, the ISSF international participation rule will be applicable (Article 3.7, Participation and ISSF Athletes, item 3.7.4 ISSF Athletes). Athletes must be fully eligible to represent Canada at the time of final nomination to the Major Games/Competition.
- Hold a valid Canadian passport that does not expire for six months past the event in which the athlete participates.
- Not use or be in possession of, by medical prescription or otherwise, unless approved by a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE), any drug that is on the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) Prohibited List or engage in any method or activity that would be in contravention to the Canadian Anti-Doping Program or World Anti-Doping Code.
- Athletes must be in good standing with the CCES at the time of final nomination to the Organizing Committee and the COC. Please refer to the SFC Antidoping Agreement found on the SFC website.
- Comply with protocols required by an event's host country as well as the current health recommendations of the Government of Canada. The athlete must have all vaccines up to date prior to final team selection. This includes all IST, coaches, or other support team members who may be attending the event on behalf of the SFC.
- Qualify to compete in an Olympic event prior to being considered for selection to compete in a non-Olympic event. Criteria for non-Olympic events may be developed upon the availability of information.

## 2. GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS FOR ALL MAJOR GAMES/COMPETITIONS:

- Competition conflict as defined within this document occurs when an athlete is competing at a Major Games/Competition on behalf of the SFC within 30 days of any 2026 selection event and within 15 days for those events in years thereafter at which the athlete would be required to compete in order to obtain ranking for the upcoming competition season.
- The SFC HPC may, at any time, and at their discretion, remove an athlete from the Canadian Major Games/Competition Team if, after following the relevant and applicable disciplinary process, the athlete has been found to have violated the [SFC Code of Conduct](#). The SFC will advise the affected athlete, in writing, of their decision to remove them from a Canadian Major Games/Competitions team.

- An “exemption” (previously “bye”) is defined in the SFC High Performance Program 2026 Team Selection Criteria (National & Development and Junior National Team) under Athlete Exemptions.

### **3. TEAM SELECTION INFORMATION FOR ALL MAJOR GAMES/COMPETITIONS**

#### **Mixed Team Selection (except Olympic Games):**

High Performance Mixed Teams are selected from current High Performance Team athletes assigned to ISSF World Cups and Major Games/Competitions. The first qualified male will be paired with the first qualified female and the second qualified male paired with the second qualified female in the applicable events.

#### **Performance Readiness**

If an athlete's performance or attitude deteriorates to a point that necessitates the HPC to question the appropriateness of the athlete competing at a Major Games/Competition, or if an athlete fails to follow the published High Performance Program criteria, or if an athlete withdraws from the event for personal or injury reasons, the HPC retains the right to replace the athlete with an alternate athlete as identified according to the criteria. Substitutions after nomination to the COC (for a Major Games) are subject to the approval of the COC Team Selection Committee.

#### **Appeals**

An appeal against a selection decision of the SFC HPC may be made as per the published SFC Appeals Policy. The SFC Appeals Policy can be found on the SFC website.

#### **Changes to this Document**

The SFC HPC reserves the right to make changes to this document that may become necessary due to a typographical error or a lack of clarity in a definition or wording, before it has an impact on athletes. Such changes must be reasonably justifiable in accordance with the fundamental principles of natural justice and procedural fairness. Any changes to this document shall be posted to the SFC website and communicated directly via email to all members of the current High Performance Program.

The SFC is bound by any changes made by the ISSF to the ISSF Qualification Ranking of the Olympic Games Selection and Eligibility Criteria (QROG) and will inform the membership as soon as known. (Subject to change pending the release of Olympic Games criteria.)

#### **Coach Selection**

Discipline coaches in rifle, pistol, trap, and skeet events, support staff and IST will be recommended by the HPC to the CEO. Coaches must comply with the requirements below to be eligible for selection at all Major Games/Competitions:

- Be a member in good standing of the SFC;
- Be in good standing with the Professional Coaching Program of the Coaching Association of Canada;
- Sign, submit, and comply with the COC Support Team and Organizing Committee Agreements on the appropriate dates outlined for each Major Games;
- Be a signatory to, respect and comply with the Canadian Anti-Doping Program of the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) and not be sanctioned or subject to a complaint under CCES policy.
- Where applicable, comply with the policies and requirements of the SFC, COC, ISSF, CAT, the IOC and the host country of the Major Games/Competitions event.

#### **Order of Precedence**

In the event of any conflict or inconsistency between the following [Table](#) and the Appendix for such Major Games/Competitions, the Appendix shall prevail.

# APPENDIX A

## Shooting Federation of Canada 2025 Junior Pan American Games Internal Team Nomination Procedures 2025-02-21 vFINAL

### Introduction

The purpose of this document is to describe the internal team nomination procedures (INP) and criteria that will be used to internally select the 2025 Junior Pan American (Pan Am) Games Shooting Team. Criteria applicable to the 2025 Junior Pan American Games are subject to the modification and approval of the Canadian Olympic Committee.

This version of the Shooting Federation of Canada's (SFC) INP was approved on February 21, 2025 and replaces any other previous version of this INP as it relates to the 2025 Junior Pan American Games. This document is to be published to the SFC website and circulated by email to all age eligible SFC High Performance and Identified Team athletes.

### Performance objective

The primary objective of the selection policy and procedures is to select the maximum number of medal potential athletes for the Jr. Pan American Games. The secondary objective is to provide international competition opportunities for the junior age-eligible athletes who are part of the SFC's High Performance and Identified team programs.

**Date of 2025 Junior Pan Am Games:** August 9-23, 2025, Asuncion, Paraguay

### Period of Qualification:

- Feb 27 - Mar 6, 2025 Rifle and Pistol Qualification Event, Asuncion, Paraguay
- Mar 7-17, 2025 Shotgun Qualification Event, Bridgetown, Barbados

The qualification period is limited to the Junior Pan Am Games Qualification Events listed above.

**Team Announcement Date: May 16, 2025**

**Athlete Eligibility** – For an Athlete to be eligible for nomination to the 2025 Junior Pan Am Games, the Athlete must:

- Must be within the U22 category (athletes born in 2004 or after). Athletes cannot be older than 21 years old until December 31, 2025; complying with article 3.7.4.12 of the International Shooting Federation.
- Must comply with COC, ISSF, Panam Sports and SFC vaccination policies. Be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 as per the current health recommendations of the Government of Canada and have all other vaccines up to date prior to final team selection. This includes all IST, Coaches, or other support team members who may be attending the event on behalf of the SFC.
- Be in compliance with all relevant COC, ISSF and Panam Sports requirements for eligibility.

- Be a member in good standing of the Shooting Federation of Canada (SFC).
- Have competed in the Junior Pan Am Games Qualification Events.
- Be a Canadian citizen and carry a valid Canadian passport; if naturalized, the ISSF international participation rule will be applicable (Article 3.6 Entry and Participation, item 3.6.3.3). Athletes must be fully eligible to represent Canada at the time of final selection.
- Be a member in good standing of the 2025 SFC High Performance Program - National Team, Development Team, Junior Team or Identified Junior Team. Such membership implies adherence to all terms and conditions of the SFC Athlete Agreement and payment in full of any outstanding accounts receivable owing the SFC.
- Sign, submit, and comply with the COC Athlete Agreement and Organizing Committee (LOC) Eligibility form no later than **June 26, 2025**. Where the athlete is under the age of 19 years, the parent or guardian must also sign these agreements.
- Not use or be in possession of, by medical prescription or otherwise unless approved by a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE), any drug that is on the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) Prohibited List or engage in any method or activity that would be in contravention to the Canadian Anti-Doping Program or World Anti-Doping Code.
- Hold a valid Canadian passport that does not expire on or prior to February 23, 2026.

#### **Support Staff/Coach Eligibility**

1. All coaches must be a registered or chartered professional coach with the CAC by June 26, 2025.
2. Have a valid passport that does not expire for up to 6 months after the Games (February 23, 2026)
3. Be in compliance with all relevant COC, ISSF, and Panam Sports requirements for eligibility.
4. Sign, submit, and comply with the COC Support Staff Agreement and Local Organizing Committee (LOC) Eligibility form no later than June 26, 2025 (*the COC registration requirement deadline*).
5. Be 18 years of Age or older.
6. Be a member in good standing of the Shooting Federation of Canada.

#### **Qualification System for the 2025 Junior Pan Am Games**

- The Qualification System can be found [here](#). In the event of changes to the qualification system and / or eligibility criteria, SFC is bound by these changes and will inform the membership as soon as possible.
- The Canadian Olympic Committee (COC) will only register competitors that were qualified according to the system established by the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF).
- The number of athletes allocated by the COC to the SFC for the Junior Pan American Games is two (2).

#### **Qualification & Team Selection**

An athlete will qualify for selection to the 2025 Junior Pan Am Games by obtaining a quota position for Canada at the qualification events listed above. Quotas are limited and athlete rankings between disciplines will be based on scores achieved in the qualification round of competition at the Qualification Events listed above using the SFC High Performance Percentage Ranking System.

Alternates will be selected based on the next ranked athlete based on their scores from the 2025 Junior Pan Am Games qualification events.

Team selection will occur no later than May 1, 2025 in events where there is an available quota spot.

As per the qualification system, quota places could be reallocated as late as April 18, 2025. Should the SFC receive a reallocated quota prior to April 18, 2025, the quota will be awarded to the next ranked athlete based on their scores from the 2025 Junior Pan Am Games qualification events. The athlete must be actively training and in good standing with SFC. The reallocated quota is only available if the two spots are not filled by SFC athletes.

No athletes will be pre-selected. Selection will only take place after the ISSF assigns the SFC's allocation of quota places to COC.

An athlete who is selected to compete in one event may, at the discretion of the SFC, also be entered into another event.

### **Appeals**

- Shooting Federation of Canada nominations to the COC for the 2025 Jr. Pan American Games may be appealed in accordance with the procedures set out in the [SFC Appeal Policy](#). Any dispute relating to the SFC Internal Nomination Procedures for the 2025 JR Pan American Games must be brought according to said Policy, or may be brought directly to the SDRCC with the consent of all parties.
- If an appeal is urgent and a decision must be made quickly, both parties may agree to bypass the internal appeal process and have the matter heard directly before the Sport Dispute Resolution Centre of Canada (SDRCC).
- Internal appeals shall be made in writing to the SFC to the attention of Susan Verdier, the SFC Technical Director. The appeals must follow the SFC appeal procedures in place at the time the team is announced.

The external nomination and selection timelines set by the ISSF, IOC and COC are very short and therefore appeals must be filed no later than 11:59pm (in the local time zone of the appellant) on May 9, 2025.

### **Decision Making Authority**

The Junior National Team Coach has the final authority over the selection of the team after consultation with the High Performance Committee (HPC) (as per below). After the selection process is completed, if any events remain unfilled, the Junior National Team Coach has the authority to fill those events. If unanticipated circumstances arise that are not covered in the selection criteria, a final and binding decision will be made by the Junior National Team Coach.

- No member of the HPC – whether a voting or a non-voting member – shall participate in any discussions or decisions regarding the nomination of any athletes with whom they have a perceived or real conflict of interest. Any member of the HPC who considers that they are in a position of a perceived or real conflict of interest must declare such a conflict before any discussions are held or decisions are made and must remove themselves from any meetings until the matter giving rise to the perceived or real conflict of interest has been resolved by the HPC.

### **On-site Decision Making Authority**

During the actual competition period onsite at the 2025 Junior Pan Am Games, all final decision making authority will reside with the team leader or in the absence of team leader, the head coach.

**Panam Sports Late Replacement Policy**

Should a nominated athlete, at any time between the sport entry deadline of July 19, 2025 and the sport technical meeting for the 2025 Junior Pan American Games, decline their nomination or be declared unable to participate in a competitive manner, that athlete shall be replaced, subject to the approval of the COC Team Selection Committee, Panam Sports Late Athlete Replacement Policy, and ISSF regulations, by the highest ranked alternate (or alternates) in their event (or events).

**Performance Readiness**

If an athlete's performance or attitude deteriorates to a point that necessitates the High Performance Committee to question the appropriateness of the athlete competing at 2025 Junior Pan Am Games, or if an athlete fails to follow the published High Performance Program criteria, or if an athlete withdraws from the event for personal or injury reasons, the HPC retains the right to replace the athlete with the alternate athlete as identified according to the above listed qualification events. Substitutions after nomination to the COC are subject to the approval of the COC Team Selection Committee. After July 19, 2025, any such replacements are also subject to the International Olympic Committee (IOC) Late Athlete Replacement Policy.

**Unforeseen Circumstances**

This INP is intended to apply as drafted and, specifically, where no athletes are prevented from competing because of an unforeseen injury or other unanticipated or unforeseen circumstances. Situations may arise where unforeseen circumstances or circumstances beyond the Shooting Federation of Canada's control do not allow competition or nomination to take place in a fair manner or in the best interests of the priorities and general principles for selection as indicated in these criteria, or do not allow the procedure for nomination as described in this document to be applied.

In the event of such unforeseen circumstances the Junior National Team Coach will, where possible, consult with the High Performance Committee to determine if the circumstances justify competition or nomination should take place in an alternative manner. In such circumstances, the High Performance Committee shall communicate the alternative selection or nomination process to all impacted individuals as soon as possible.

Any changes due to unforeseen circumstances shall be posted to the SFC website and communicated directly to all members of the 2025 High Performance Program electronically.

**Funding**

Athletes are expected to attend all qualification events and training sessions on a self-funded basis.
